

THE STUDY

This report contains the results, analyses, conclusions and some recommendations based on a survey undertaken to assess customer response and preferences to the Rock-A-Fire Explosion, its characters and its music.

Data was collected by means of personal interviews with customers exiting 3 separate ShowBiz Pizza Places (105th & Metcalf, 12280 W. 63rd and 4601 E. Bannister Road), all in the metropolitan Kansas City area. Interviewing was conducted between July 28 and August 5, 1982.

A total of 407 customers (drawn equally from the three restaurants) were interviewed. The sample was comprised of adults, teenagers and pre-teenagers in proportions which earlier research indicates is representative of the age mix of ShowBiz's clientele.

SAMPLE CHARACTERISTICS

The sample was comprised of persons in the categories and magnitudes listed below:

CONCLUSIONS

... how many performances (or shows) did you watch ... ?

- On the average, customers watched approximately 3.76 shows per visit. Adults averaged 4.13 shows, pre-teens averaged 3.54 shows and teens averaged 2.78 shows per visit.
- Almost all customers rate the show quite positively.

However, pre-teens are somewhat more likely to say they are excellent (46%) and teens are somewhat less likely to say they are excellent (30%).

 Of those who had an opinion about the relative quality of the new shows (Best of Rock-A-Fire) versus the old shows (69% of all interviewed), most felt the new shows were better.

- Of those who "couldn't say" (31%), there was a larger proportion of adults (38%) than teens (33%) and a much larger population than pre-teens (17%).
- (Unaided ... from pictures) Can you tell me the names ...
- A full 75% of all the customers could name (unaided) at least one character and 73% could correctly identify (unaided) Billy Bob. Twenty one percent (21%) named Mitzi and 14% named Fatz. The other characters (except Dook LaRoo) were named by 7 to 9% of the adults. Pre-teens did much better with 92% naming at least one character, 89% naming Billy Bob, 32% naming Mitzi and 10 to 18% naming most of the other characters except Dook LaRoo. Teens did less well than pre-teens but better than adults.
 - · Fatz is easily the favorite character of most customers. Although Billy Bob essentially ties with Fatz for pre-teens.

There appears to be some degree of gender related preferences (Fatz, Mitzi, Earl and Rolfe) at least for adults and some age related differences.

 People can't seem to do much in the way of identifying particularly "liked" shows (53% couldn't single out a show/ shows) other than the birthday songs (12%). See Results Section for some specifics. No real negative comments were made with any frequency.

- · People (customers) like music and talk (73%) better than music only (22%) or talk only (1%).
- Two-thirds (65%) thought they would "sing along" if those type of songs were shown (words) on the t.v. screen.
- There are definite age related preferences in types of music (for the band). Below are rank ordered preferences by age group.

Women have a stronger (more frequent) preference for children's songs (46%) than do men (25%) and likewise for Ballads (17% to 7%).

Across all ages Overall, Rock & Roll music (not so hard) as a general type of music was suggested most frequently (56%) for the band while 1950's type music (much of it is early rock and roll) was the second most frequently mentioned (33%) type of music (by type of music only and before specific examples were introduced). Children's songs (26%) and Country and Western songs (25%) were also mentioned with respectable frequency.

After interviewers introduced 5 specific and representative "older songs" (not currently on pop charts) as examples of 8 different types of music (examples were randomly selected from longer lists generated by radio station personnel and relevant background materials) customers picked among the various types of music and selected specific titles (as suggestions). Customers most frequently (61%) choose at least one specific title from the 1950's list but a majority (54%) also selected at least one title from music from the 60's.

Customers were given a number of both positive and negative comments gleaned from recent focus group sessions and asked to indicate which described their feeling about the shows and characters. Results indicated a high frequency of positive type reactions and little support/agreement with negative type comments.

Clearly the shows and characters have the most appeal for adults either for their own enjoyment or their assumption that their children will be entertained by the shows/characters. One need to keep in mind also who is in the Show Room. Results from an hourly count over a seven day period in one K.C. ShowBiz indicates that on the average 42% of all those in the Restaurant were observed in the Show Room and within this number, 64% were adults, 10% were teens and 26% were pre-teens.

Comparable data from Des Moines showed 48% and 49% of the people were (on the average) observed in the Show Room during the two hourly census measures. Within these numbers, 52% and 55% were adults, 17% and 12% were teens and 31% and 33% were pre-teens.

The above findings are reinforced by telephone survey research (Des Moines) of adult customers who list "Shows" 50% and 46% of the time (most frequent response) when asked what they like about ShowBiz. Clearly the Shows are "a" (if not the) primary reason for coming to ShowBiz. However, it is quite probably that the "games" and "food" (see data below) emerge as equally (?) important reasons for returning (see below—Des Moines data) to ShowBiz. More specifically, the games and food are even more important to more kids (teens and pre-teens) as reasons for returning than are the shows. Shows, however, remain an important element even if not the most important element.

New shows when they become available should be a primary marketing point for attracting return business as customers indicate a strong interest and a likely return trip to see new shows.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Consider ways to capitalize on (use) Fatz's popularity along with the present emphasis on Billy Bob. The gorilla
 has appeal! Also keep Mitzi active for females. Consider "Kids Rock Concerts" and special promotion on shows/
 characters. Emphasize shows in new markets to attract initial visits.
- Program music decidedly for adults . . . but acceptable to and including songs for . . . pre-teen children. Build music programs on popularity (old top teners, Elvis, Beatles, Beach Boys, etc.). Include chatter (continuity) from characters between songs.
- Stress shows in newer areas for encouraging <u>initial</u> visits and stress <u>new</u> shows when available for encouraging return business.
- · Develop a few "sing alongs" with words on t.v. displays for a pilot test of this approach.
- Give some thought to the differences in "volume" reactions from kids vs. older adults. Might consider a kids area (up front) and a concommitant volume gradiant from close-up to back-of-room.
