- 4. ShowBiz Pizza Place, Inc., through its parent company, Brock Hotel Corporation, is able to have national contracts for the purchase of several items not limited to food, beverage, paper products and supplies. The Franchisee may incur higher costs for these items.

6. ShowBiz Pizza Place restaurants are located primarily in the midwest and the sunbelt of the United States. The Franchisor is unable to state whether or not the geographic location of the restaurant will have a bearing on sales.
